

Working Lands for Wildlife (WLFW)

Southwestern Willow Flycatcher Focus Area - HIGH PRIORITY AREA

The Focus Area includes the riparian areas that occur adjacent to the stream (generally within the flood-prone areas); as identified using SVAP2 or the NM Riparian Assessment. In addition, the grazing land immediately adjacent to the Focus Area, at its farthest extent from the streambank (i.e. the upper terrace), is eligible for WLFW.

Counties with Known Species Occurrences - MEDIUM PRIORITY AREA

The southwestern willow flycatcher is listed as federally Endangered wherever it is found, but it is known to occur in these counties. Streams/riparian/floodplain with potential for flycatcher habitat (as identified in the WHEG) is eligible for WLFW, with the same criteria as mentioned above.
