

Working Lands for Wildlife (WLFW)

Southwestern Willow Flycatcher Focus Area - HIGH PRIORITY AREA

The Focus Area includes the riparian areas that occur adjacent to the stream; generally within the flood-prone areas (i.e. 100 yr. floodplain). In addition, the land immediately adjacent (i.e. the 500 yr. floodplain) to the Focus Area is eligible for WLFW.

Counties with Known Species Occurrences - MEDIUM PRIORITY AREA

The southwestern willow flycatcher is listed as federally Endangered wherever it is found, but it is known to occur in these counties. Streams/riparian/floodplain with potential for flycatcher habitat (as identified in the WHEG) is eligible for WLFW, with the same criteria as mentioned above.
